

Smith Organ 1931-1985

The first pipe organ at Our Saviour's was a 2 manual 9 rank Seeburg-Smith theatre pipe organ installed in 1931. This organ served the former sanctuary until June, 1961 when the building was demolished to make room for the new edifice. The Smith was re-installed and served this congregation until May, 1985.

Skinner Organ 1985-present

The second and present pipe organ is a 2 manual 12 rank E.M. Skinner Opus 460 built in 1924. The organ's first home was The Lutheran Church (now St. Luke), Ithaca, New York.
